Funders Attending

Ballinger Charitable Trust

Supports registered charities and community groups throughout the North East through two funding streams: up to £5,000 and over £5,000. The Trust's main themes are young people, the elderly and cultural and arts projects. www.ballingercharitabletrust.org.uk

Banks Community Fund

Provides support to community groups, voluntary organisations and environmental projects. Up to £5k is available for capital projects which benefit the local community within a short radius of a Banks operation. www.banksgroup.co.uk/corporate-responsibility/banks-community-fund

BBC Children in Need

Provides small grants (up to and including £10,000) and main grants (over £10,000) to projects that improve the lives of children and young people experiencing disadvantage. www.bbc.co.uk/corporate2/childreninneed

Community Foundation Tyne & Wear and Northumberland

Makes grants to voluntary and community groups across three broad themes: supporting people to overcome disadvantage, creating stronger communities and making the area a good place to live. The average grant is £4,500 (with some funds offering larger amounts). The Foundation is extremely accessible and open to non-registered charities as well as registered charities. www.communityfoundation.org.uk

Greggs Foundation

Provides grants and support to projects that make a positive difference to the lives of disadvantaged people within local communities. Funds include the Local Community Projects Fund, Environmental Grants and North East Core Funding. www.greggsfoundation.org.uk

Hadrian Trust

Provides funding of between £500 and £2,000 to registered charities working in the fields of social welfare, youth, disability, the elderly, women, ethnic minorities, education, arts and the environment. www.hadriantrust.co.uk

The Joicey Trust

Makes grants for either revenue (including core funding) or capital expenditure. The grant-makers meet twice a year and will only fund registered charities up to 10% of total project costs (a 'last piece of the jigsaw' funder). www.thejoiceytrust.org.uk

Rothley Trust

Gives small grants of up to £1,000 to assist registered charities. The Trust focuses on the needs of children and young people in areas of disadvantage. It also supports community development and the groups which help people with disabilities. www.rothleytrust.org.uk

RW Mann Trust

Helps improve the lives of people and communities in North Tyneside, South Northumberland and East Newcastle areas with grants of up to £1,000 for a wide range of activities. Open to registered charities only. www.rwmanntrust.org.uk

Sport England and Tyne & Wear Sport

Invests in community sport in a variety of ways. They run a number of different funding programmes which are open to a wide range of clubs, voluntary and community organisations. www.sportengland.org
